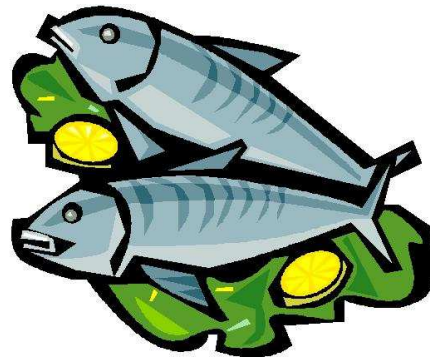

Greetings, Parishioners, and Happy St. Patrick's Day. St. Patrick arrived in Slane, Ireland on March 25, 433. He met the chieftain of one of the druid tribes, who tried to kill him. After an intervention from God, Patrick was able to convert the chieftain and preach the Gospel throughout Ireland. There, he converted many people -eventually thousands – and he began building churches across the country. St. Patrick often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing St. Patrick's message. St. Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions.

After years of living in poverty, traveling, and enduring much suffering he died March 17, 461. He died at Saul, where he had built the first Irish church." https://www.catholic.org/saints/saint.php?saint_id=89.

May we all aspire to be like St. Patrick. Last Thursday, our students participated in a day of almsgiving in honor of St. Patrick. 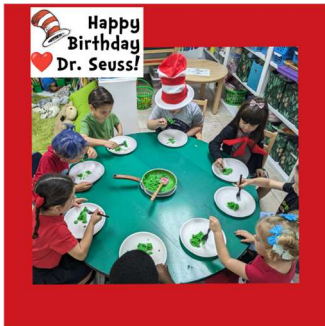

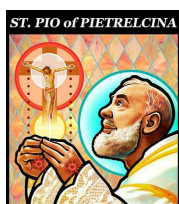

Después de una intervención de Dios, Patricio pudo convertir al cacique y predicar el Evangelio por toda Irlanda. Allí, convirtió a muchas personas, eventualmente a miles, y comenzó a construir iglesias en todo el país. San Patricio a menudo usaba tréboles para explicar la Santísima Trinidad y reinos enteros finalmente se convirtieron al cristianismo después de escuchar el mensaje de San Patricio. San Patricio predicó y convirtió a toda Irlanda durante 40 años. Hizo muchos milagros y escribió sobre su amor por

Dios en Confesiones. Después de años de vivir en la pobreza, viajar, y soportando muchos sufrimientos murió el 17 de Marzo de 461. Murió en Saúl, donde había construido la primera iglesia irlandesa https://www.catholic.org/saints/saint.php? saint_id=89. Que todos aspiremos a ser como San Patricio.
